GOAL


Development of a regional plan and functional network within coastal states of the Gulf of Mexico, highlighting priority actions and common interests.

OBJECTIVE



What do Gulf MPAs look like?



Gulf of Mexico Marine Protected Areas Network

The site-based network of marine protected areas (MPA) is using the 'power of place' to cooperatively conserve and restore the Gulf of Mexico and raise awareness of the value and

quality of life, the environment and the economic vitality of the region. The Network was formed in April 2011 and includes places of significant national value such as National Parks, National Wildlife Refuges, National Marine Sanctuaries, and National Estuarine Research Reserves.

Vision

Develop a site-based network of coastal and marine protected areas using the 'power of place' to cooperatively conserve and restore a shared ecoregion, and to raise awareness of the value and importance of these areas to our quality of life, environment and economic vitality.

Mission

To improve coordination, cooperation, communication, and collaboration among Gulf coastal and marine protected areas by creating opportunities for collective environmental planning and response; information sharing; leveraging resources; and conveying a common message.

- Easy access to information and expertise




Next Steps: PHASE II - Implementation

Pesto and lemon juice help to flavor this tasty pasta salad. Add a little diced cooked chicken, shredded cheese, or ham for a heartier supper salad.

Cook Time: 10 minutes

Total Time: 10 minutes

Ingredients:

8 ounces rotini pasta

1/2 medium cucumber, peeled and diced

1 cup diced seeded tomato

- · 1 can (approx. 2 1/2 ounces) sliced black olives, drained
- · 1/2 red bell pepper, diced
- 1/4 cup chopped celery
- · 2 tablespoons finely chopped red onion, optional
- · 3/4 cup mayonnaise

- · 2 tablespoons prepared pesto
- · 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon salt, or to taste
- · 2 tablespoons fresh chopped parsley, optional

Preparation:

Cook rotini in boiling water following package directions. Drain, rinse with cool water, and set aside to cool.

Toss the pasta with the lemon cucumber, tomato, black olives, bell pepper, celery, and onion, if using.

Combine the mayonnaise, pesto, lemon juice, pepper, salt, and parsley, if using. Combine with






